About the company

Ben E. Keith Co. is a broadline food service distributor located throughout the United States, primarily in the south, operating 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Their building in New Mexico was built just a few years ago in 2021, however, some equipment and processes were identified as opportunities for improved efficiency.

Ben E. Keith was a previous participant in the PNM Business Energy Efficiency Programs and adopted a continuous improvement approach to save energy. This time, a retro-commissioning assessment was performed to focus on the ammonia refrigeration system. It identified efficiency opportunities such as setpoint adjustments, VFD modifications, and permanent LED dimming. Eager to get started, they set a 3-6-month timeframe to complete the project, and with minimal training, integrated the recommendations seamlessly within the facility's existing processes. Following the efficiency improvements, the facility saw a 20% reduction in energy use.
